PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The MPS is pleased to present our 25th Annual Psychopharmacology Update. The program will once again feature morning lectures focused on evidence-based psychopharmacology and an afternoon question and answer panel discussion. This year, the morning theme will be disorders associated with anxiety. Our opening speaker, Dr. Liang Yuan, from Tufts, will provide an update on a psychopharmacology algorithm for PTSD, with added perspectives from recent studies and reviews and from her work with civilian PTSD patients. This will be followed by a presentation on psychopharmacology algorithms for generalized anxiety disorder and social anxiety disorder by Dr. David Osser, from Harvard South Shore Psychiatry Residency Training Program. The final morning lecture will be on psychopharmacology treatments for alcohol use disorder, presented by Dr. Domenic Ciraulo, Professor of Psychiatry at Boston University School of Medicine. This topic relates strongly to the other lectures because of the large number of patients with PTSD and anxiety disorders who have issues with alcohol usage.

After lunch, the meeting will proceed to the successful and well-received Q&A format first introduced at the Psychopharmacology Update two years ago. The idea, once again, is to provide a more efficient learning experience by addressing the specific questions clinicians in practice have rather than relying exclusively on lectures, which may contain content one already knows or that is not particularly relevant to one's practice. We have assembled another distinguished panel of experts with different areas of specialization. Our morning faculty will be joined by the following panelists: Laura Bajor, DO; Lynn DeLisi, MD; A. Eden Evins, MD, MPH; Anthony Jackson, MD; Eran Metzger, MD; Anthony Rothschild, MD; and Gary Sachs, MD. These experts will address questions in the areas of schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, anxiety disorders, psychotic depression, PTSD, substance abuse, smoking cessation, geriatric psychiatry, child and adolescent psychiatry and veteran affairs.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Panelists will have the opportunity to present 2-3 slides before the Q&A session begins, on what they consider to be the most important recent practice-changing developments in their area. We ask that attendees come prepared with questions and write them on the index cards provided in their conference packet. MPS staff will collect questions throughout the program but members may also submit questions in advance to meps@psychiatry-mps.org. Questions will be sorted and consolidated by the moderator and addressed to the appropriate panelist(s). There will be two one-hour Q&A sessions, separated by a 15-minute break for refreshments.
